Debt sales deal done

THE planned sale of six properties with rates in arrears will no longer go ahead after property owners finally came to an agreement with the Bundaberg Regional Council over the long overdue bills.

Bundaberg Mayor Mal Forman said the council had resolved at a meeting on November 20 last year to sell 22 properties at a public auction scheduled for tomorrow at the Civic Centre.

He said owners of all but six of the 22 properties identified had paid outstanding amounts before the April 20 notification of auction.

"I am pleased to advise that the rating liabilities of the final six properties have now been resolved."

Cr Forman said selling properties was a final resort, only taken by the council to recover rates overdue for three years or

Racist rant exposed in CCTV

A CITY supermarket at the centre of a racially motivated verbal attack on an ethnic woman by another shopper has released CCTV footage of the confrontation.

The NewsMail ran a story in Saturday's paper after speaking to Wendy Fay, who witnessed the woman being abused by a drunken man for wearing a scarf inside the Bundaberg Plaza Supa IGA last Wednesday.

Miss Fay said the man had repeatedly yelled, "you're in Australia now, you can't wear that sh*t on your head", while other shoppers watched on silently.

But store owner Kevin Cast said his staff did all they could to help the woman.

"Staff escorted the lady out to the car and stayed with her and packed her groceries away," he said.

"She wasn't abandoned at

Mr Cast said by the time the store manager reached the checkouts, the man who carried out the attack and his friend had left the store.

'They were obviously drunk - they never bought anything," he said.

Mr Cast said releasing the CCTV footage might prompt the woman to come forward, as he was told police could not act unless a complaint was made.

The footage shows two men, the abuser in a black hat at right and a companion, entering the store, walking around and then leaving.

"I don't know who the wo-

man is." Mr Cast said.

"If the woman comes forward, maybe we can do something about it.

"I certainly don't tolerate (what happened) - it's harassment.'

Mr Cast said the staff did all they could to ensure the woman left the store safely.

"The store did act – it appeared (in the article) as if we had done nothing," he said.

Labor's racing deals in probe

CONTRACTS for racetrack works in regional Queensland will likely come under the microscope after the Queensland Government ordered an inquiry into allegations of "golden handshake payouts" and "murky backroom dealings".

The Commission of Inquiry, announced yesterday, will be directed to investigate Sunshine Coast firm Contour Consulting Engineers which was allegedly awarded 37 contracts through the former Labor Government with only one put out to tender.

The firm completed track work at Caloundra's Corbould Park, was project manager for the \$7.9 million upgrade to the Ooralea racetrack at

Mackay completed last year and carried out work at Callaghan Park in Rockhampton.

Attorney-General Jarrod Bleijie said the inquiry was a response to serious allegations raised in recent weeks about \$150 million "being thrown around" between the former Labor government and the former **Queensland Racing** bosses.

But Mr Bleijie said he would leave the decision to call former premier Anna Bligh and former treasurer Andrew Fraser, and whether to examine contracts in regional Queensland, to the commissioner he was yet to appoint.

The three-month inquiry will begin on July 1 and is expected to cost \$3 million.
